

Appeal Process for Students Denied Admission to the PSEO/Concurrent Program

An applicant who is denied admission to the Minnesota State University, Mankato PSEO/Concurrent program may request consideration through written appeal to the Extended Learning Admissions Appeals Committee. Applicants must provide:

1. A letter of appeal from the applicant stating why she/he should be considered for admission. The letter of appeal, at a minimum, should address factors such as:
 - Challenging pattern of a student's course work
 - Evidence of exceptional achievement, aptitude or personal accomplishment not reflected in high school rank or test scores
 - Evidence of steady improvement in academic performance and/or having overcome barriers to educational achievement.
2. Three (3) recommendations from individuals who can provide insights about the student's academic performance (teachers, counselors, etc) and academic potential as a PSEO/Concurrent student.
3. Any other pertinent information such as updated test scores.

Upon review of the appeal materials, applicants will be contacted and informed if the appeal is denied or if it will move forward with a meeting with the Extended Learning Admissions Appeals Committee.

Students who are admitted upon appeal will be placed on Contract Admission and will be required to meet specific academic performance targets determined by the Extended Learning Admissions Appeals Committee and the student.
