

MATHEMATICS PLACEMENT

The Math Placement Assessment is given to help students determine which Math class to enroll in based on current Math skills. The assessment is used to place students into an appropriate level in order to be successful. All students are required to satisfy the Mathematical/Logical Reasoning Goal Area 4 for general education and/or to complete specific mathematics courses required for their major. Please see the opposite side of this sheet to review the minimum mathematics course requirements for your major. These guidelines will help you determine how best to select the initial mathematics course you will need.

Placement Guidelines for Mathematics Course Enrollment:

Students seeking enrollment in a college-level mathematics course must demonstrate readiness to succeed in the course through one of the following means:

1. ACT or SAT mathematics sub-score, or
2. ACCUPLACER Test results, or
3. Successful completion (grade "C" or above) in the required pre-requisite course.

Required test scores and pre-requisite courses are outlined in the chart below:

- Students who do not satisfy any of these requirements are placed in Math 098 Intermediate Algebra. Math 098 is not a college-level course and will not count toward graduation credits. This course DOES count toward enrollment credits for purposes of financial aid, insurance, VA, etc. This course ALSO provides a good foundation for your future enrollment in college-level mathematics courses.
- If you have not taken the ACT or SAT test **within the last year**, it is recommended that you take the math placement assessment.
- If **no ACT Math sub score appears** on your confirmation letter, you are required to take the math placement assessment.
- If you are **undecided** about your major, it is recommended that you take the math placement assessment. The major you eventually decide to pursue may have a specific math requirement. Completing a college-level math course will keep your options open and will help satisfy the general education requirement in Goal Area 4.
- If you plan to major in any of the majors requiring a specific mathematics course (as listed on the opposite side), it is **highly recommended** that you take the math placement assessment regardless of your ACT Math sub score.
