

NOTICE OF VACANCY

OPENING DATE: November 28, 2016

POSITION: English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Teaching Assistantship(s): Department of English

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Review of applications will begin on February 1, 2017 and continue until filled. Students are encouraged to apply for Graduate Teaching Assistantships at the same time that they apply for admission to the College of Graduate Studies. All applicants will be notified by April 2017.

SALARY: Up to \$9000 plus tuition stipends, dependent upon availability of funds, period of appointment, and assignment. Appointments made after the tenth day of classes are not eligible for tuition waiver.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Graduate EAP Teaching Assistants teach one four-credit section of English for Academic Purposes per semester during the academic year, supervised by the department EAP Director. Each section focuses on teaching either literacy or oracy skills to multilingual students. New Teaching Assistants must report for a one-week workshop on August 7, 2017. Classes begin on August 21, 2017.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's Degree in English or related field with strong concentration of coursework in English or Education.
- Admission to the College of Graduate Studies at Minnesota State University, Mankato.
- Strong English language speaking skills.
- Literacy teachers must also have strong English writing skills, especially technical skills in grammar, mechanics, and the documentation of source materials.
- Ability to work harmoniously with undergraduate students, faculty, and other teaching assistants.
- Enrollment in a minimum of six (6) graduate credits per semester during assistantship.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Enrollment in graduate degree program in TESL at Minnesota State University, Mankato.
- Strong interest in teaching academic literacy and/or oral skills to multilingual students.
- Demonstrated ability in research-based academic writing.
- Experience with people from culturally different backgrounds.
- Teaching experience, preferably teaching English as a second or foreign language.
- Interest in integrating technology into the classroom.
- Time management and organizational skills.
- Demonstrated commitment to fostering a diverse working and learning environment.

RELATED INFORMATION:

New graduate teaching assistants are required to enroll in a training course that runs August 7, 2017 to August 11, 2017 and continues meeting weekly during the fall semester. They must also participate in a TA mentoring program and participate in program assessment activities.

Contingent on satisfactory performance as a teaching assistant, satisfactory academic progress, and available funding, there is a possibility that this appointment may be continued beyond the initial period of employment. Applications will be accepted and kept on file through December 2017. Additional vacancies will be filled from applications remaining in the pool at the time of the vacancy. All applications in the pool become inactive on January 31, 2018.

NOTICE OF VACANCY

The English Department at Minnesota State University, Mankato includes master's level programs in Creative Writing (MFA), English Studies and Literature, Technical Communication, and TESL, and undergraduate programs in the same fields, as well as majors in English Education and Film & Media Studies. ACADEMIC WRITING SAMPLE DESCRIPTION

Background: EAP literacy courses are four-credit courses that teach writing skills relevant to academic, public and professional writing situations. In these courses, students write to explore, inform, argue, and analyze, through writing assignments that go through an extended writing cycle. Students brainstorm, draft, receive teacher and peer feedback, revise, and edit their work. Most formal writing assignments given in these courses are source-based. Students read challenging texts in a range of genres and practice synthesizing the authors' ideas in their writing. Students also hone their research writing skills: learning to assess the credibility and relevance of academic and non-academic sources is an important focus. Therefore we require an academic writing sample (5-10 pages, double-spaced) of applicants.

Writing Sample Criteria:

1) Structure and Development

- Orients the reader with controlling idea
- Organizes ideas logically and develops them fully
- Unifies and focuses paragraphs
- Crafts an introduction and conclusion appropriate for an academic writing situation

2) Sources

- Uses sources that are credible (as determined by such criteria as currency, authority, and non-bias) and that advance his or her purpose
- When using sources:
 - Accurately rephrases passages or central ideas
 - Quotes discriminately
 - Integrates sources throughout the text by introducing them and following them up with explanation/analysis
 - Adheres to MLA or APA or Chicago Manual of Style citation conventions

3) Content

- Works with complex ideas
- Supplies logical reasons and evidence for assertions

4) Sentence-level Correctness

- Demonstrates strong technical skills in areas such as grammar, syntax, spelling, and punctuation
