

NOTICE OF VACANCY

OPENING DATE: February 17, 2017

POSITION: Teaching Assistant for Film Studies: Department of English

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Review of applications will begin on March 1, 2017 and continue until filled. All applicants will be notified by April 2017.

DATE OF APPOINTMENT: August 21, 2017

SALARY: Up to \$10,000 plus tuition stipends, dependent upon availability of funds, period of appointment, and assignment. Appointments made after the tenth day of classes are not eligible for tuition waiver.

RESPONSIBILITIES: The Teaching Assistant for Film Studies assists English Department film faculty in the implementation of pedagogical improvements in several introductory film classes (such as Introduction to Film, Film Appreciation, and Introduction to Film Production), and supports additional curricular innovations that will permit an expanded emphasis on film studies and film production in the department.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's Degree in English, Film, or related field with strong concentration of coursework in English
- Admission to the College of Graduate Studies at Minnesota State University, Mankato
- Demonstrated ability in research-based academic writing
- Strong technical skills in grammar, mechanics, and the documentation of source materials
- Ability to work harmoniously with others
- Enrollment in a minimum of six (6) graduate credits per semester during assistantship

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Enrollment in graduate degree program in English at Minnesota State University, Mankato
- Strong interest in film studies
- Preparation to support a film production class
- Interest in integrating technology into the classroom
- Time management and organizational skills
- Demonstrated commitment to fostering a diverse working and learning environment

RELATED INFORMATION: Contingent on satisfactory performance as a graduate assistant, satisfactory academic progress, and available funding, there is a possibility that this appointment may be continued beyond the initial period of employment. Applications will be accepted and kept on file through December 2017. Additional vacancies will be filled from applications remaining in the pool at the time of the vacancy. All applications in the pool become inactive on January 31, 2018. The English Department at Minnesota State University, Mankato includes master's level programs in Creative Writing (MFA), English Studies, Film & Media Studies, Technical Communication, and TESL, and undergraduate programs in the same fields, as well as a bachelor of science in English Education and minors in film studies and linguistics. The department is also responsible for the university's large composition program and offers general education courses in literature, film, writing, popular culture, and humanities.
