CSET Department Chair Memo

The Department Chairs within the College of Science, Engineering and Technology had submitted a memo of concern with the new graduate faculty policy. After at-length discussion, it was recommended that the Department Chairs from the College of Science, Engineering and Technology develop a proposed policy to bring forward to the Committee. It was noted that as the current policy is already approved any additions or changes to it would need to be submitted through the approval process once again. Secott will take this information back to the College of Science, Engineering and Technology Department Chairs.

Review of Graduate Research Faculty Applications

The Committee agreed to begin the review of the applications from faculty in programs that will offer doctorate degrees in 2007-2008. The review will be continued at the May 7th meeting.
