There are four objectives: profession training of artists and scholars in chosen areas of specialization, preparation for art educators, elective study for students in all areas of the university and service to the local communities as a source of cultural enrichment. The Department of Art is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Art and Design.

- a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50
- passing portfolio review
