### Program Description:

Studying French provides insight into the literature and culture of France and other French-speaking countries. It also gives students a knowledge of language that enables them to work and travel in areas of the world where French is spoken. To facilitate these goals, the department sponsors a summer program in France. Students choosing to take advantage of this study-abroad opportunity, or who acquire language experience on their own initiative, may receive credit if arrangements are made in advance.

### Admission Requirements:

Admission to the major is granted by the department. Minimum University admission requirements are:  
 -a minimum of 32 earned semester credit hours  
 -a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 ("C")  
 Contact the department for application procedures.

### Advising:

You are expected to meet with your advisor on a regular basis to ensure courses are taken in an order that will lead to successful completion of the degree.

1. All major courses must be taken for credit and the student must receive a grade of C or better (C minus does not count).
2. Study Abroad is highly recommended. See you advisor for information.
3. Students must take two Diverse Cultures courses from two different disciplines - Either one Purple and one Gold, or two Purple as part of their General Education requirements.
4. In General Education goal areas where two courses are required, courses must be from different disciplines.
5. Students must take two Writing Intensive courses.
