Program Description:

Studying German provides insight into the literature, culture and history of German-speaking countries. It also gives students knowledge of the German language that enables them to work and travel in areas where the target language is used. Students should strongly consider studying in a German-speaking country, using for instance the Minnesota State Mankato's direct exchange program that are one semester or year-long. Typically, students plan to participate in a long-term study program during their junior year.

Admission Requirements:

Admission to the major is granted by the department. Minimum university admission requirements are:

- a minimum of 32 earned semester credit hours
 - a minimum accumulative GPA of 2.00 ("C")
 - a minimum GPA of 2.5 is required in all German courses. Contact the department for application procedures.
- Contact the department for application and placement procedures.

Advising:

You are expected to meet with your advisor on a regular basis to ensure courses are taken in an order that will lead to successful completion of the degree.

1. All major courses must be taken for credit and the student must receive a 2.5 in all German courses.
2. Study Abroad is highly recommended. There is a semester and two-semester program available and a bi-annual short-term study program (3 credits). See your advisor for information.
3. Students must take two Diverse Cultures courses from two different disciplines - Either one Purple and one Gold, or two Purple as part of their General Education requirements.
4. In General Education goal areas where two courses are required, courses must be from different disciplines.
5. Students must take two writing intensive courses.
