Program Description:

Students in the Spanish program acquire language proficiency and cultural competency that prepares them to work and travel where Spanish is spoken. Students at the end of their program will meet the National Standards for Foreign Language Learning.

Admission Requirements:

Admission to Major is granted by the department. Minimum University admission requirements are:
 - a minimum of 32 earned semester credit hours.
 - a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 ("C").
 Contact the department for application and placement procedures.

Advising:

You are expected to meet with your advisor on a regular basis to ensure courses are taken in an order that will lead to successful completion of the degree.

1. All major courses must be taken for credit and the student must receive a grade of C or better (C- does not count).
2. Study Abroad is highly recommended. See your advisor for information. All Spanish classes, with the exception of SPAN 210w and SPAN 450, can be taken as study abroad.
3. Students must take two Diverse Cultures courses from two different disciplines - Either one Purple and one Gold, or two Purple aspart of their General Education requirements.
4. In General Education goal areas where two courses are required, courses must be from different disciplines.
5. Students must take two Writing Intensive courses.
