Program Description:

The dental hygiene curriculum is designed to provide opportunities for the student to develop a sound clinical and theoretical foundation for the practice of dental hygiene. The graduate is prepared to fulfill the dental hygiene roles as clinician, change agent, educator, researcher and consumer advocate as put forth by the American Dental Hygienists' Association.

Admission Requirements:

Application to the Dental Hygiene Program is a separate process in addition to being admitted to the University. Requirements for application for admission to the Dental Hygiene Program include:

- * Completion of at least 36 semester credits.
- * A minimum grade point average of 2.5 (realistically this is closer to 3.0)
- * Successful completion of the following courses:
 - * BIOL 220 Human Anatomy
 - * ENG 101 Composition
 - * CMST 100 Fundamentals of Communication
 - OR
 - * CMST 102 Public Speaking
 - * PSYCH 101 Introduction to Psychological Science
 - * SOC 101 Introduction to Sociology
 - OR
 - * SOC 150 Social Problems
 - * STAT 154 Introduction to Statistics
 - OR
 - * SOC 202 Introduction to Social Statistics
 - * DHYG 100 Perspectives in Dental Hygiene
 - * DHYG 219 Head and Neck Anatomy and Histology (Either DHYG 219 or DHYG 225 must be completed by the time of application. The other must be completed prior to enrolling in other DHYG courses within the program).
 - * DHYG 225 Oral Anatomy
- Two of these courses must be completed by the time of application:
 - * BIOL 330 Principles of Human Physiology
 - * BIOL 270 Microbiology
 - * CHEM 111 Chemistry of Life Processes

In January of this term you will apply for your Dental Pin to take the National Board exam. Once you have been approved by the Dept. Chair you can contact the Pearson testing service to set a time for your exam. You will also be taking the Central Regional Dental Test in April. This test is a practicum which tests skills working on a live patient. The last test is the jurisprudence test which is a test of the laws and duties governing dental professionals in the state. This test leads to licensing by the state upon successful completion of all three exams.

PROGRAM NOTES

DHYG 333 (2 credits) is required in the summer between Terms 6 and 7. It starts immediately following Term 6 and is usually completed by June 1.
