### Program Description:

This option prepares men and women to teach family consumer science in grades 5-12 and for other education-related professions.

### Admission Requirements:

Family Consumer Science Education major admission requirements include: A minimum of 32 earned semester credit hours, a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75. Contact the department for application procedures.

Professional Education admission requirements include a minimum of 32 earned credit hours, a minimum of cumulative G.P.A. of 2.75, evidence of registration for MTLE Basics Skills Exam, enrollment or completion of KSP 220W, C or better in ENG 101, C or better in general education MATH required for admission to Professional Education.

All courses required for major option must be at "C" level or higher.

### Advising:

You are expected to meet with your advisor on a regular basis to ensure courses are taken in an order that will lead to successful completion of the degree.
