### Program Description:

The Department of Ethnic Studies was established as an academic unit in 1989 at Minnesota State University, Mankato. The first program review took place in 1993 at a time when the Department was in the process of transition to an independent academic unit. Many of the recommendations the consultant made have been implemented while others remain a challenge and an opportunity. To date, it is a small department but growing majors and the only graduate program in ethnic and multicultural studies in the upper-Midwest. Therefore, it continues to lead in this academic discipline through the dissemination of academic knowledge that considers the historical and contemporary dynamics of race and ethnic relations in the national and international contexts. Among the most important goals that the Department of Ethnic Studies fulfills is that of promoting diversity as demonstrated not only in the curriculum but also by the recruitment and retention of diverse students and faculty. These goals are strategically consistent with the mission and objectives of the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences and Minnesota State University-Mankato.

### Admission Requirements:

Admission to Major: Students enrolling in 300-400 level courses must be admitted to the program. Admission to Major is granted by the department. Minimum University admission requirements are:

- minimum of 32 earned semester credit hours
- minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 ("C")
- Required Minor - any
