## MSU volleyball wins fifth straight match

**MOORHEAD** — Kimber Kuhl had 13 kills to lead the Minnesota State volleyball team to its fifth-consecutive victory Tuesday.

The Mavericks swept Minnesota State-Moorhead 25-19, 25-14, 25-22 to improve to 18-11 (13-5 in Northern Sun Conference).

Freshman outside hitter Alli Rice led the team in digs with 19, while senior outside hitter Ashley Nachreiner posted 10 kills and 16 digs. Freshman setter Brittany Stamer had 34 assists.

With the first set tied 15-15, the Mavericks went on a 10-4 run, getting three kills from sophomore outside hitter Amanda Beekman to grab the early advantage.

The Mavericks continued that pace in the second set, as Kuhl, a sophomore, had three kills during a 15-5 run to start.

Minnesota State jumped out to a 10-3 lead in the third set. The Dragons cut it to 17-16, but that was as close as they'd get.

The Mavericks will return to Mankato for their final two matches of the regular season. They will take on Northern State at 7 p.m. Friday and Mary at 4 p.m. Saturday.
