Game scores were 25-18, 25-21, 21-25, 25-21.

Amanda Beekman record a team-high 16 kills, and Kimber Kuhl added 11. Amanda Thompson and Ally Kwikkel each contributed 10 kills.

Brittany Stamer passed out 48 assists, and Alli Rice made 19 digs and five ace serves. Kuhl had five blocks.
