Kehler to show off skills

MANKATO — Minnesota State women's hockey goaltender Britni Kehler was named to the NCAA Frozen Four Skills Challenge, which will be held April 11 at the Pepsi Center in Denver.

Kehler, a Mitchell, Manitoba, native and an MSU senior, will be a member of the West team.

The two Skills Challenge teams will each have 10 men and 10 women, including four goaltenders.

The competitions will include puck control relay, fastest skater, hardest shot, rapid-fire shooting, accuracy shooting and penalty shot.

Players were nominated by their coaches and selected by representatives of the American Hockey Coaches Association and the NCAA.

Kehler went 11-20-2 in her final collegiate season with a

.911 save percentage and 2.72 goals-against average. For her career, she set a school-record with 43 wins in 108 games and compiled a .914 save percentage and a 2.75 goals-against average with 12 shutouts.
