MSU splits doubleheader at Rebel Spring Games

KISSIMMEE, FLA. — The Minnesota State University softball team (6-5) earned a split with Indiana University of Pennsylvania Monday in its third day of competition at the Rebel Spring Games.

In Game 1, the Mavericks found themselves down 5-2, but scored four runs in the fourth and added an insurance run in the sixth to take the 7-5 win.

MSU belted eight hits and held the Indians to three. Junior Samantha Rohr picked up the save, pitching shutout ball over the final five innings.

In the second game, junior Mallory Michel went 1 for 3 with two RBIs as the Mavericks dropped a 4-3 decision. Rohr pitched the first four, striking out six. Sophomore Brooke McKelvogue handled the final two innings and only gave up one hit.

The Mavericks continue action at

the Rebel Spring Games today when they face Lock Haven University at 8 a.m. MSU then faces the University of Wisconsin-Parkside at noon.

Second baseman Nick Gonzalez had four RBIs, and Zach Danelson and Kosuke Hattori each had a pair of hits to lead Minnesota State to a 9-7 win over Northwood University (Fla.) on Monday in Fort Pierce, Fla.

The Mavericks had a six-run second inning, highlighted by Adam Sudbeck's solo homer.

Freshman Chris Odegaard got the win, pitching $3\frac{2}{3}$ innings of relief and allowing four runs on seven hits.

MSU (12-4) continues play today in Florida with a doubleheader against University of Wisconsin-Parkside.
