Mavericks eliminated

GRAND JUNCTION, COLO. — Minnesota State lost 13-4 to Colorado State-Pueblo and was eliminated Friday at the Central Region baseball tournament.

The ThunderWolves scored in the bottom of the first inning, but the Mavericks (38-17) responded with a run in the top of the third when Geno Glynn's grounder was mishandled with the bases loaded, allowing Steven Helget to score.

After the ThunderWolves went up 4-1, Glynn's sacrifice fly scored Kosuke Hattori in the fifth, and Hattori's sacrifice fly in the sixth scored Matt Kuchenbecker to make it 4-3. It was Glynn's 58th RBI of the season, the second most in program history and one short of Jason Pfingsten's total in 1996.

Colorado State-Pueblo scored five runs in the sixth, and the Mavericks answered in the seventh on Aaron Berner's sacrifice fly to right, which scored Danny Miller. The ThunderWolves tacked on four runs in the seventh to finish the scoring.

Brett Fratzke, who gave up three hits, three earned runs, two walks and struck out one in four innings, was the losing pitcher.
