

MSU to induct 7 individuals, 1 team into Hall

MANKATO — Minnesota State University will honor its past this weekend with four individuals scheduled for induction into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame and three individuals into the Athletics Hall of Distinction. MSU will also induct the men's cross country and track teams from 1969-70.

The new Hall of Fame members are men's cross country/track stand-out Dan Baumgartner (1970), men's basketball guard Monte Dufault ('93), All-American pitcher Weston Weber ('86) and women's golfer Jodi Wendt ('95).

The new Hall of Distinction members (people who have made significant contribution and/or brought honor to MSU Athletics) are Marge Burkett (MSU volleyball coach 1986-97), Pam Macias ('79) and Rob Schabert (MSU Sports Information Director 1977-81).

This year's Jim Schaffer Service Award will be presented to Dr. Todd Kanzenbach and this year's MSU Athletics Philanthropic Award recipient is Brian Fowler of Quality One-Hour Foto/Sports Pix.

Official ceremonies take place at the Hall of Fame Induction Dinner in CSU Ballroom on Friday. Registration is at 6 p.m. and the program begins at 7 p.m.).

The MSU football team hosts

Winona State at 2 p.m. Saturday in the annual Homecoming Game. The inductees will be introduced at halftime.

Anyone interested in attending the dinner may reserve tickets by calling the MSU Department of Athletics at 507-389-6111. The following is a thumbnail sketch of this year's honorees:

Dan Baumgartner (cross country/track & field, 1966-69): A five-time letterwinner (three in cross country and two in track) was team captain on both North Central Conference championship cross country and track teams as a senior when the teams went undefeated. The MSU cross country team finished second in the nation in 1968. Baumgartner was an All-American in track.

Monte Dufault (men's basketball, 1988-93): An All-North Central Conference guard as senior, Dufault led MSU in assists his junior and senior seasons. His 1,365 points ranks 12th on MSU's all-time list. Holds or has held MSU records for career games played (116), three-pointers made in a season (93 in

1991-92), career three-point percentage (.468, 220/470), single-season steals (74 in 1991-92), career steals (209) and steals per game (2.6 in 1992). Named All-Region second team as a senior. Named MSU's Senior Male Athlete of the Year for 1992-93.

Weston Weber (baseball, 1982-86): A 15th round draft pick by the Oakland A's in 1986, Weber was a member of the North Central Conference championship team, regional championship team and NCAA Division II 4th-place finish team of 1986. He was an NCC Most Valuable Pitcher and a second-team All-American as a senior with a 9-1 record and 2.42 ERA (64 Ks in 72.1 innings pitched).

Jodi Wendt (golf, 1991-96): The 1994 NCC women's golf individual champion, Wendt was a two-time All-American and finished fourth at national tournaments in 1994 and 1995. She won eight tournament titles during course of her career. Wendt led Mavericks to third place finish at 1992 national tournament. She was the 1994-95 MSU Athletics Female Medal of

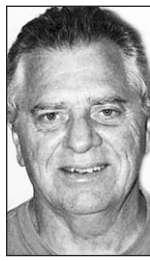
Honor recipient.

Marge Burkett (volleyball coach, 1986-97): Compiled a record of 211-181 in her 12 years with the Mavericks and her 211 victories stands as the most-ever by a MSU volleyball coach. Burkett was named the North Central Conference Coach of the Year in 1989 and led the Mavericks to five 20-win seasons. MSU made its first NCAA Division II postseason appearance in 1990 under Burkett's guidance. Her 1996 team established a school record for wins in a season when it went 26-12.

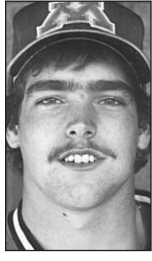
Pam Macias (women's athletics, MSU 1975-79): A three-year varsity softball letterwinner, Macias earned a total of seven letters in three sports (basketball, volleyball, softball). She was named an All-State catcher her last two years. Macias officiates college and high school volleyball, officiating at the Minnesota state high school volleyball tournament for 16 years. She was inducted into the Minnesota Volleyball Hall of Fame in 2004 as a clinician.

Rob Schabert (Sports Information Director, 1977-81): The college's first full-time SID, Schabert produced 26 CoSIDA award-winning publications during his four-year tenure with the Mavericks. He oversaw public relations nickname transition from Indians to Mavericks in 1977, assisted with radio broadcasts, coordinated game program advertising sales, arranged media coverage, served as staff photographer, provided statistical support, etc., for every MSU team. Schabert left MSU to take the SID position at Tennessee Tech University, where he still works today.

Men's Cross Country/Track & Field (1969-70): The team captured the North Central Conference cross country, indoor track and outdoor track and field titles. The roster included John Savonen (CC All-American), and outdoor track All-Americans David Jones (third in the three-mile run) and Mike Hazelhoff (fifth in the high jump). Among the other top competitors were Jack Pollard, Roger Spee, John Peterson, Mike Hazelhoff, John Moes, Obie Kipper, Sam Oleson, Gene Bygd and Dan Baumgartner. The teams were coached by MSU legends Earl "Bud" Myers and Chuck Petersen.
