**Markato Loyola
defeats Holy Trinity**



Minnesota State at South Dakota

The Mavericks (1-5, 0-2 in North Central Conference) have a tough task today, looking for their first conference victory against eighth-ranked South Dakota (6-0, 2-0).

Linebacker Jimmie Gunn, who had a career-high 16 tackles with two interceptions, was the NCC's co-defensive player of the week. Gunn has a team-high 62 tackles. Darnell Flannigan has 15 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. The Mavericks have nine interceptions, just two short of last season's total.

Kyle Krivoruchka has 76 receptions in his career, good

for 17th in school history. Jim Mars (1967-70) is 16th at 81 catches. Sean Treasure needs 18 yards rushing to move into the top 10 all-time at Minnesota State. Treasure has 1,524 yards in his career; Ron Krisik (1970-73) ranks 10th at 1,541. Treasure ranks ninth

with 21 rushing touchdowns.

South Dakota is averaging 57.8 points per game, with a victory margin of 40.1 points. The Coyotes are leading Division II in total offense (634.0 yards), rushing (315.0) and scoring. Quarterback Wes Beschorner has completed 88 of 117 passes for 1,828 yards with 23 touchdowns and two interceptions. Running back Stefan Logan has 895 yards rushing, closing in on 1,000 yards for the third time in his career. Linebacker Ryan Hedden has 33 tackles, and tackle A.J. Schaible has seven sacks and 10.5 tackles for loss.
