After several years of unsuccessful attempts, we have finally gained the rights to produce *Chicago*, among the most popular musicals on our biannual audience survey. In addition, when Mel Brook’s hilarious movie-turned musical-turned movie musical *The Producers* became available we scooped it up, too.

*Chicago* will be presented Sept. 30-Oct. 3 & Oct. -10, 2010, in the Ted Paul Theatre. *The Producers* will be presented April 7-10 & 14-17, 2011, also in the Ted Paul.

We hope these musical book-ends will encourage you to join us for the entire season by purchasing a season subscription for just \$85

(plus \$5 processing fee). That’s because we think the rest of the season has its own fair share of ‘razzle dazzle.’

*Who’s Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* is Edward Albee’s classic story of George and Martha, a college professor and his wife who were portrayed on stage and screen by the naturally dynamic couple of Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor. We haven’t presented this show since summer 1968, and it’s definitely worth another look! It will be presented Oct. 14-17 & 20-24, 2010, in the Andreas Theatre.

Next is *The Odyssey*, by Homer but adapted by Mary Zimmerman from the translation by Robert Fitzgerald and originally directed by Mary Zimmerman. If Zim-

## Notes from the Call Board

### Seeing Record Numbers

This fall, the Department of Theatre & Dance welcomes a record number of new students and its largest ever number of MFA students.

This year's Theatre freshman class includes 28 new faces! Add to that the 12 new Dance majors and 10 students who transferred here from another institution. In addition, we've got 20 MFA students!

### Children's theatre tour

This year's touring production of *Rikkie Recycle & the Eko-Kidz!* was seen by about 10,000 southern Minnesota school students. This year's production, *Iktomi*, hopes to duplicate that feat. Iktomi is a Lakota Indian "jokester" who will appear in three stories. Written/directed by third-year MFA Musical Theatre candidate **Deanne McDonald**, musical com-

position/direction will be by second-year MFA Musical Theatre candidate **Lauren Mikeal Parsons**.

### Tour targets high schools

This year, BFA students **Megan Volkman-Wilson, Kim Steffen, J. Alexander Coe** and **Aaron Alan** will be going out on tour to high schools performing in a show titled *Broadway Jukebox*. When they arrive, they will offer students at the hosting school the chance to hear songs performed from three of these six Broadway shows: *Avenue Q, Chicago, Hairspray, Spring Awakening, Phantom of the Opera* and *Wicked*. This will introduce the talents of Minnesota State Mankato directly to high school students.

### Kerr-Berry's leadership noted

Director of Dance **Dr. Julie Kerr-Berry** was recognized by the National

Dance Education Organization with an Outstanding Leadership Award for 2010.

merman's name sounds familiar, it's because she's also the author of *Metamorphoses*, the "pool play," that we presented in 2004. As we did with that production, we'll be bringing back faculty emeriti Tom Bliese and multiple award-winning Music alum Michael Croswell to design sets and music, respectively. Both join us as Andreas Guest Artists.

Performance dates for *The Odyssey* are Nov. 11-14 & 18-21, 2010, in the Ted Paul Theatre.

Starting the new year, we will be presenting *Born Yesterday* in the Andreas Theatre. We've presented this show twice before, in 1958 and 1995, but the story about a corrupt tycoon who hires a newspaperman to help educate his showgirl mistress seems like it could be ripped from today's

headlines ... so we're doing it again.

Dates are Jan. 27-30 & Feb. 2-6, 2011.

Our last play of the season is old, but its main character has been brought back to life so many times we figured he was due for another resurrection. *Dracula*, the Bram Stoker story adapted by Hamilton Deane and John Balderston, will be presented Feb. 17-20 & 24-27, 2011, in the Ted Paul Theatre.

But don't let your MSU Theatre & Dance enjoyment end there. Each semester we stage an engaging **Dance Concert** in the Ted Paul Theatre that shows off the additional talents of our students. Performances in the fall semester will be 7:30 p.m. Dec. 3 & 4 and 2 p.m. on Dec. 4. In the spring, performances are 7:30 p.m. on April 28 & 29, with the 2 p.m. matinee on April 30.

Plus, we have four Studio shows that are sure to pique your more adventurous brand of curiosity. Coming in just a couple of weeks is our opener, *Copenhagen*, directed by third-year MFA Directing candidate (and actor!) Michael James. Also this semester, in the spot filled by *The Rocky Horror Show* last season, is *Evil Dead: The Musical*. It's sure to get your heart pumping!

Then in the spring, we'll share *A Coupla White Chicks Sitting Around Talking* and *Frozen*.
