COPENHAGEN by Michael Frayn

Werner Heisenberg was a German physicist who went to Copenhagen where he lived and worked with the older Niels Bohr on quantum theories. The play, a fictional dialogue based on historical figures and events, is based on a meeting between Bohr and Heisenberg in Copenhagen in 1941 not long before the advent of the atomic bomb. It debuted in London in 1998.

CHICAGO, music by John Kander, lyrics by Fred Ebb, book by Fred Ebb and Bob Fosse

In roaring '20s Chicago, chorus girl Roxie Hart murders a faithless lover and convinces her hapless husband Amos to take the rap ... until he finds out he's been duped and turns on Roxie. Convicted and sent to death row, Roxie and another "Merry Murderess," Velma Kelly, vie for the spotlight and the headlines, ultimately joining forces in search of the "American Dream": fame, fortune and acquittal.

WHO'S AFRAID OF VIRGINIA WOOLF? by Edward Albee

George, a professor at a small college, and his wife, Martha, have just returned home, drunk from a party. Martha announces, amidst general profanity, that she has invited a new young professor and his wife to stop by for a nightcap. In the end, the mystery in which the distressed George and Martha have taken refuge is exposed, once and for all revealing the mess they have made of their lives. Note: This production contains adult language and situations.

THE ODYSSEY, adapted from the translation by Robert Fitzgerald and originally directed by Mary Zimmerman

The epic story mainly centers on the Greek hero Odysseus (or Ulysses, as he was known in Roman myths) and his 10-year journey home following the 10-year Trojan War. In his absence, it is assumed he has died, and his wife Penelope and son Telemachus must deal with a group of unruly suitors competing for Penelope's hand in marriage.
