#### Mavathon Raises \$27,000 for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare

"Mavathon," Minnesota State Mankato's Dance Marathon, had another successful year. Nearly \$27,000 was raised for CMN Hospitals, with Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare being the local hospital benefiting from our students' efforts.

In the 8 years since its return, Dance Marathon has raised more than \$150,000 "For the Kids." The event is the biggest Dance

Marathon in the state of Minnesota, and it has become the most successful student-run philanthropic event at Minnesota State Mankato. Throughout the year, the planning committee puts in a lot of work to plan the big event, and the participating teams host a variety of fundraisers to work towards the goal. Local families whose kids are Gillette patients attend the actual Mavathon event. They look forward to being there and sharing what Gillette has meant to them.
