Incoming international student updates from CELP:

Right now, there are many pieces of information around opportunities for the fall. Planning on a large incoming international student base coming in, especially from Chuo University.

- Last semester we had 99 students from Chuo University taking online courses. If covid permits, they will be planning to take courses in person at MSU. They are being cautious about covid so time will tell if they will be coming.
- They are asking that we don't charge them until the first day of classes because it could change last minute if they can come or not.

Tokai University- Good negations are happening with them. We are hoping at some point to resume communication around if they can send students.
