 - Enrollment is slightly down
 - Pandemic is affecting minority students in multiple ways

 - o Applications for next AY is down 10% for all applications
 - o Applications for International students is up 60%

 - Glen
 - Asked about vaccinations for fall? Requirements for students- inquiries from our partners in South Korea and Japan
 - Anne: has been discussed at meet and confers -> Guidelines will come from the Systems office.

 - Jehad: class is developing mock research studies
 - Strong indication of interest in health care for international students during a pandemic- at least primary care
