2. Discuss Strategic Plan

- Add a point emphasizing need for continuous monitoring of the relevance of the plan respective to internal and external forces and make changes accordingly on an ongoing basis, e.g., when priorities or targets change

3. Revisions to forms: Global Education Travel and Curriculum Grants

GEAC reviewed the revised 2019-2020 Travel Grant documents. The focus of the funding for the 2019-2020 cycle is supporting faculty travel to conduct a site-visit for a future faculty-led program specifically instead of professional travel for other purposes, such as partnership development. Global Education will also advertise the next round of Curriculum Grants and awards will be granted based on available funds.
