PSEO Student Advising Form – Transfer Planning

This form is intended to help PSEO students build their schedule for the upcoming semester. This form does not need to be collected by the PSEO Office.

How to Transfer Plan

Step 1: Determine what classes you need to take for high school – **PRIORITIZE THESE CLASSES**

Indicate all remaining high school graduation credits, along with how many college credits would satisfy that requirement. Be as specific as possible. (Ex: Biology vs Science)

0.25 high school credits = 1 college credit 1 high school credit = 4 college credits

Step 2: Identify where you want to go to school after high school.

•	College/university
•	Maior

Step 3: Research this college/university. Do they have a four-year plan for your intended major?

- Check their website
- Example: Iowa State University > Accounting
- Do they have a four-year plan for your degree? Use the four-year plan to help guide your degree planning
- Optional: meet with an academic advisor at their college/university to set-up a fouryear plan

Step 4: Utilize Transferology to ensure classes will transfer from Minnesota State University, Mankato to your school of choice.
