Determining General Education Courses

<u>Step 6</u>: On a sheet of paper, write down all of the required general education courses for your major.

- For example, for the accounting program, goal areas 4, 5, 6, and 9 have **pre-selected courses for those goal areas**. Students need to take these specific courses within those goal areas. This does NOT mean these are the only general education courses a PSEO students needs to take.
- Students should make sure they are paying attention to <u>all general education</u> <u>requirements</u>. For example, although goal area 5 for accounting has **ONE class** required, a total of **TWO classes** must be completed to fulfill goal area 5.
- <u>Blank goal areas listed do not have pre-selected courses</u>. However, students still need to fulfill these goal areas. Students can select any course they want using the <u>General</u> <u>Education Guide</u>.
