 RE-enrollment: 111 (26%) more students enrolled for fall semester than we did last year at this time.

- 4 searches going on in our office: 1 AD in final stages, 1 AD in the last phase of hiring, 1 AD interviewing, 1 customer service rep position which has not been posted.
- Inviting students into TerraDotta in if they have a summer internship opportunity. Slowing bringing campus partners in as well.
- Scholarship updates (IMS): Big changes coming soon! Service piece of the scholarship will be going away to allow students have more time for academics. Scholarship amount will remain the same. Potentially able to use a Rate Code for the scholarship, so the amount of financial support is immediately available.

• Center for English Language Programs

- Statistics of the program
 - (Olga Nelson): 66 students total in Fall 2023, 37 were full semester students. 29 short-term (3-week) program from Chuo University. Exchange numbers are strong, but degree-seeking dwindling. IUGB is the largest group this semester.
 - 70 confirmed students for Fall 2024 already. 15 accepted degree-seeking students among them.
 - Will begin issuing I-20s via TerraDotta. Implementing MavConnect for their current student tracking.

o Program Update

- (Paolo): Travel to Taiwan to initiate new partnerships and meet with agents. Reviewing custom programs with different Universities.
- Intensive English Program for Global Citizens: Summer 2024 is focusing on college-age students.
 Summer 2025 will hopefully have programs geared to high school and college-aged students.
- Spring 2025: Customized programs for both Tokei University and Konsei Medical University (March 17-28) that are geared towards their specific student population at the contract stage for these customizable programs.

- Final stages of hiring a new CELP Instructor/Coordinator
- Promoting homestay opportunity on Radio Mankato together with staff from Homestay USA
